### Age-Appropriate Tasks:

#### Ages 2-3:

1. Pick up toys and put in proper place.

5. Clean up what they drop after eating.
6. Clear own place at the table. Put the dishes on the counter.

8. Sort/put away items to be recycled.
9. Put dirty clothes in hamper.

#### Age 4:

1. Set the table
2. Put the groceries away.
3. Feed the pets.
4. Help do yard and garden work.
5. Help make bed.
6. Help fill the dishwasher.
7. Dust the furniture.
8. Prepare cold cereal.
9. Help make a sandwich.
